#### **Our Mission:**




#### AVEY believes that . . .

FUNDING:





# **OUTCOMES:**


In 2017-18, the Family Development Matrix was completed on 368 case managed families at 5 FRCs as Initial and Year-End. 1X% moved out of crisis into stability and X% families maintained or increased to Stable or Safe/Self Sufficient levels. In 2018-19, 6 FRCs had 431 case managed families but evaluation is not yet complete.

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
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
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
